MISSIONARY PRAYER NEEDS

October 5, 2025 – October 11, 2025

Pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Luke 10:2

Sunday – *Wesley & Lisa Waites* (Westminster UK – Seminary Student) give thanks Joel has been spreading the gospel at school, and two friends are coming to church. Pray that God will save Timmy and Harry and their families. Prayer for Wesley, who had an accident on his bike last week on his way to seminary. A dog cut into his path, and he went over the handlebars. He's doing ok but broke a bone in his hand; he cannot drive until it heals, which will take 4-6 weeks. Please continue to pray for his studies and the boys' schooling.

Monday – *Carla Stevens* (MTW/MINTS—Global) gives thanks for the great progress made in training the team's new Academic Program Administrator, Susan Newkirk. Pray that Susan can quickly raise her support so she can join us full-time. Pray also for God's clear direction for the PS78Teachers' team as they meet and plan with several potential partners this month. Pray for wisdom in setting priorities.

Tuesday – *Nathan & Kasia Tunnell* (GPTS - Seminary Student) ask for prayer for tonsils & adenoids removal surgery for Blake, Oct. 7th, and Amelia, Oct. 10th. Pray for Emma's celiac flare-up and the meeting with her doctor. Pray for Nathan's endurance this semester. Pray for wisdom as they start working on their mission's budget and prepare to fundraise full-time and for the military conflict in Eastern Europe to end.

Wednesday – Remember Christians in Mexico: Many people in rural areas practice Christopaganism, and there is a strong Marxist movement in the south. Criminal gangs and cartel activity are also a threat. Pray for the protection of Christians vulnerable to hostility from criminal gangs and their own indigenous community. Pray for God's provision for Christians who are faithful witnesses for Christ. Pray that Bibles would become more available in rural areas. Pray that outreach bases in remote areas will bear spiritual fruit in reaching indigenous groups with the gospel.

Thursday – *Steve & Jenna Lammers* (RUF – UF) ask for prayer for the fall sermon series and for the student leaders who are reaching out to incoming students with welcome events. Pray for students who came to faith in Christ last school year to continue to grow spiritually. Pray that Christ would be exalted in all RUF activities and that Christian students would value things of first importance and that their lives would bear fruit for years to come.

Friday – Waller & Mary Tabb (Wycliffe – USA) give thanks for good health and safe travels, including driving 1,000 miles on Ugandan roads. Thankful for finishing Micah and Nahum in Lubwisi and good progress checking 1 Chronicles in Lunyole. Pray for Waller as he begins checking 2 Samuel in Keliko and Deuteronomy 1-11 in Lugungu. Pray that gospel conversations during the trip will encourage two people and that a classroom of HS students will put their trust in Christ.

Saturday – *Donald & Claire-Lise Cobb* (MTW – France) ask for prayer as Donald teaches an introductory course on the New Testament to pastors, elders, and Sunday school teachers of the Malagasy church in France. Pray for him as he leads teaching at two church-weekend retreats this fall on the topic of "The Church as a Community of Disciples." Pray for the young men he is discipling. Pray they will find more ways to distribute the book they edited (combining 15 booklets on basics of Christianity) in the French-speaking world.
