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MISSIONARY PRAYER NEEDS

November 16, 2025 – November 22, 2025

Pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Luke 10:2

Sunday – Nathan & Kasia Tunnell (GPTS - Seminary Student) ask for prayer for Nathan’s endurance, clarity of mind, and a continued passion for missions in his final year at seminary and during preparation for his licensure exam. Pray for strength, wisdom, and encouragement for Kasia as she supports Nathan and cares for the children. Pray for continued wisdom for Amelia’s medical team and that the process of getting her a wheelchair goes smoothly. Pray for the children’s school and their language learning.

Monday – Wesley & Lisa Waites (Westminster UK – Seminary Student) ask for prayer for Wesley's seminary studies and that the plans that the Lord has for him after seminary will be an easy path to see. Thankful for the continued healing of Wesley’s broken wrist; pray that it will be restored to full movement and strength soon. Pray for God’s help and strength for Lisa in her day-to-day home life. Pray for healing for Joel’s broken finger and that the boys would continue to develop in their schooling.

Tuesday – Jane Brinkerhoff (MTW – Japan) asks for prayer for the Downtown Bible Study Nov. 19th and the Praise and Testimony Time Nov. 29th. Pray for the monthly Sunday afternoon gathering for Jr. High, H.S., and college youth (*none are professing Christians*) who don't attend church due to obligatory activities on Sunday mornings. Pray for spiritual growth and encouragement for new believer, Mr. T., and his desire to witness to his mother. Thankful for being welcomed back to the County Handicapped Home after a five-year absence.

Wednesday – Remember Christians in North Korea: Young people live in a tug-of-war between their government’s strict control, the allure of forbidden pop culture, and the search for meaning through superstition or hidden faith. Pray for underground Christians seeking to nurture them to fulfill their God-given purpose and mission. Pray with believers for their children and grandchildren to remain faithful. Pray for field workers who briefly cross the border to disciple the youth.

Thursday – F & I (1st Pres. Church Weaverville – Sensitive Areas) give thanks that F. received his green card. Pray that the government shutdown will not interfere with his flights to France this week to teach at a church and visit his folks. Pray for his mother’s recovery after a heart procedure and for his gout to improve. Pray for him as he works to schedule his international travel for next year.

Friday – Esaïe & Natasha Etienne (MTW – Dominican Republic, Haiti) give thanks that Esaïe was able to visit Trinity PC in Haiti last month, and that Dociné Christian School started its academic school year peacefully. Pray for stability and security in Haiti. Pray for the people in the Southern part of Haiti who have been affected by Hurricane Melissa, where 43 people have died, and a lot of the farms have been swept away. Pray for the churches in Gonaïves: Trinity PC, Dociné PC, and The Truth PC.

Saturday – Evan & Bonnie Jones (EFI – West Africa) give thanks for his recent visit to Africa Bible University in Uganda, which has partnered with EFI to provide students training in farming to prepare them for both reaching farmers and providing for themselves after school. Pray for further travel in Africa to work with Presbyterian churches teaching agriculture techniques and digging wells to provide for local churches.

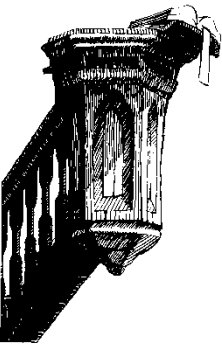
